Everyone in the Scoil Uí Mhuirí community is extremely proud of Eoghan and his achievement!



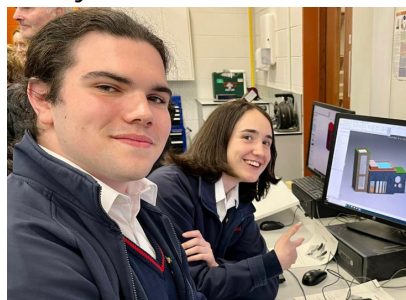
Teachers

Teachers continue to work on developing subject areas, resources and other opportunities for students.

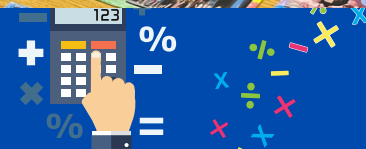
Open Night!
